# Need of Skill Development in India

In an era of rapid technological advancements and globalization, the importance of skill development cannot be overstated. As new technologies emerge, job roles change, and market demands evolve, it becomes crucial for individuals to acquire and enhance their skills to stay relevant and contribute to economic development globally.

With one of the world's youngest population, India is paving the way towards becoming the World's Skill Capital. However, in an ever-evolving workplace, disruptive changes and new business models will profoundly impact the employment landscape over the coming years. Many significant drivers of transformation currently affecting global industries are expected to significantly impact jobs, ranging from significant job creation to job displacement and from heightened labour productivity to widening skills gaps.



## FICCI Skill Development

Realising the importance of Skill Development for achieving India's ambitious growth targets and the need for a Skilled Workforce for the Industry, FICCI established the Skill Development Committee (SDC) in 2007. For the year 2023, the SDC is being chaired by Mr. K. Ramakrishnan, Chief Executive – Skill Development Mission, Larsen & Toubro, Co-chaired by Mr. Sanjay Shivnani, Head, Technical Education & HTU, Hindalco Industries Ltd. and Mr. Manoj Agrawal, Executive Vice President – Training Academy, Maruti Suzuki India Ltd. The committee consists of all major stakeholders of the Indian skill development ecosystem like sector skill councils, non-government organizations, and multilateral & bilateral organizations along with representation from companies like **Tata Steel, Mahindra and Mahindra, Adobe, Schindler, Oppo, Subros, JBM Group, VLCC, TCS iON, Aditya Birla Group, Schneider Electric** to name a few. For this year, SDC has identified and initiated Policy & Advocacy and Thought Leadership in the areas of Apprenticeship, high quality demand driven skilling, capacity-building programs for Traditional Clusters and Skill Financing.
